

Destination – Cadboro Bay

Charts – 3423 & 3313 (sheet 4)

Position – 48 27 26 N , 123 17 63 W Off the head of Cadboro Bay. Just west of Cadboro Bay Park.

Description – A reasonably sheltered anchorage with very good holding in a hard grey mud/sand/shell bottom. The wakes of vessels transiting Oak Bay/ Baynes Channel do reach the anchorage and cause some rolling. The beach at the park is suitable for landing a dinghy.

Navigation – Straight forward, it is recommended that if approaching from the southwest Fiddle Reef be passed on your port side before turning north. If approaching from the northeast – Jemmy Jones Island be passed on your starboard side before turning north. Anchor in 4-5m over a sticky mud bottom with very good holding. There are a number of mooring buoys in the bay north of Royal Victoria YC floats.

Facilities – Park with toilets, a restaurants and a pub nearby plus a bus stop.

Recommendations – A good anchorage for a first night out and an interesting spot to look some fascinating homes while walking or rowing.
