

SECTION B - US Yacht Clubs (San Juan Islands and Puget Sound)

Anacortes Yacht Club - at Cap Sante Marina in Anacortes. Limited reciprocal moorage October through April. Check with Cap Sante Harbormaster. Free moorage between April 15 and October 15 limited to 2 consecutive nights within 30-day period. Max 6 nights per year. 2 reciprocal slips located in NE corner of marina - slips Q-13 and P-19. Check-out time is noon. Power, 30-amp at \$4 per day. Water available at berths. Contact marina after 8 am on the day of arrival on channel 66A or at 360-293-0694 for reciprocal berths or same day reservations, then register with marina staff on arrival. Clubhouse located at northeast end of Boat Haven, near P and Q docks. Open Friday nights 5:30 to 8:30 pm for cocktail hour. <http://www.anacortesyachtclub.org/>

Bellingham Yacht Club - in Squalicum Harbor. First 24 hours free at dock directly in front of clubhouse. Power is \$3 per day for 30 and 20-amp outlets and water is available on dock. Bremerton Yacht Club - in Phinney Bay on south side of Port Washington Narrows which connects to Puget Sound (N47°35.29, W122°39.75). About 250 feet of dock with 30-amp power and water. Guest moorage is located between the three strings of covered moorage against the west side of the north-south running dock. Register with Facilities Manager/Caretaker at clubhouse and show current membership card. If Clubhouse closed, register the first morning open. Gate key deposit is \$5 and power is \$1 per day per cord. All auxiliary equipment should be off between 8 am and 10 pm unless departing. First 3 days free, two weeks per calendar year. Brownsville Yacht Club - at the Port of Brownsville Marina. Limited to two days per calendar month and no more than four days per calendar year. 90 feet of breakwater guest moorage available. Rafting not permitted. First come first serve basis. 30-amp power fee paid at the Port Office. Water on docks. Camano Island Yacht Club - Located on Saratoga Passage on the northwest side of Camano Island, east of Oak Harbour. Clubhouse with kitchen and bar, barbecue, picnic area and three mooring buoys. Dinghy float from May to September provides loading and unloading. Brunch served in clubhouse on second Sunday of each month from 9 am to noon. Call Kath Bakken, Rear Commodore, 360-387-2444 for buoy reservations and further information. No website.

Corinthian Yacht Club of Bellingham - Located at the east entrance of Squalicum Harbor. Proceed past Marina Restaurant (on starboard). Bow is pointed to "O" dock. At the west end of this dock is sign directing you to CYC's reciprocal slips. Guest moorage availability is limited to Corinthian members vacating their berth. First day free after

Corinthian Yacht Club of Seattle - Moorage at head of "S" dock in Shilshole Bay Marina. 48 hours free on first come, first served basis. If reciprocal moorage occupied, two nights' moorage is available on "J" dock, to the south of club house. Electricity extra. Restrooms, laundry and shower facilities available and chandleries and restaurants nearby. Public transportation to downtown Seattle. Moorage limited to 48 hours. Reciprocal moorage is also available but not guaranteed at Dock Street Marina (in front of Glass Museum). Reservations can be made in advance at 253-572-2524. Guests must submit paid receipt along with copy of current membership card directly to the Yacht Club for reimbursement. CYCT address is 5624 Marine View Drive, Tacoma, WA 98422. Moorage only. Duwamish Yacht Club - located on Duwamish River, 45 minutes up river from Elliot Bay, 1/2 mile past 14th Avenue Bridge. "Normally raised" train bridge in first half mile. Listen to channel 14 for broadcast of impending closure and time delay. Two more bridges further up river with **center clearances** of 32 and 14 feet. Request opening via horn signal if necessary. Enter at incoming tide to cancel river current. Current can be significant after heavy rain on outgoing tide. One 45-foot side-up tie available at end of "B" dock, adjacent to pumpout. 30-amp power (\$3 night) and water on docks. To register visit registration kiosk at head of reciprocal dock where a dock/main gate/clubhouse and pumpout key is located. Check sign-up sheet for available member slips. Small clubhouse contains restrooms, showers and laundry. Grocery store, casino, several restaurants within walking distance. Fidalgo Yacht Club - in Cap Sante Boat Haven in Anacortes. 1 berth for yachts from May 15 to September 15 in slip Q10 (48°30.9N and 122° 36.3W) and another in Q8 (June 15 to September 15). From September 15 through May 15 reciprocal moorage limited. 2 consecutive nights free in a 30-day period per boat with maximum 6 days per year. Register with Harbormaster (7 am to 5 pm) on channel 66 (US mode) or by telephone, 360-293-0694. Same-day reservations encouraged. 30-amp power at \$4 per day and water on floats. Flounder Bay Yacht Club - in Skyline Marina in Anacortes. First day free then \$10/day (including power). Visits limited to 5 days per year. 30-amp power at \$3 per day and water on docks. Gig Harbor Yacht Club - at Peninsula Yacht Basin Marina at head of Gig Harbor, east of Anthony's Restaurant (47°20N, 122°35W). Rafting permitted. First 48 hours free at 80-foot guest dock. Water and power available on docks. Shower, restroom behind office. Check chalkbook next to office for available slips if reciprocal moorage full. Registration at marina office - if closed registration slips in metal box on office windowsill. Shopping within walking distance - Costco store and mall short bus ride away. International Yacht Club of BC - moorage at Drayton Harbor, Blaine, Washington. One night free, maximum 2 nights per year. First come first served. Entrance to marina marked by red triangle to port. Sign also points to transient float in front of office. Contact harbor office on VHF 68 and register reciprocal moorage with Harbor Master. Must clear customs if entering from or returning to Canada (Customs clearance at Semiahmoo Bay). Power, water, showers, laundry, fuel, and pump out. Kingston Cove Yacht Club - in Port of Kingston Marina. Two 50-foot berths at head of guest dock available. \$4 per day facilities fee, then 30¢/ft for up to 3 nights. Milltown Sailing Association - at Port of Everett Marina on south visitor dock in front of Anthony's Restaurant and also directly north on pier next to old Everett Yacht Club building and in front of gas dock. Navy Yacht Club - at Port of Everett Marina. 2 slips available. 48 consecutive hours moorage, one visit per month. Oak Harbor Yacht Club - in Oak Harbor Marina. 2 berths, Nos. F-50 and F-51 available May 15 to September 1. 30-amp electricity and moorage free for 48 hours. Water and pump-out on F dock. Restrooms, showers and laundry at marina building.

Olympia Yacht Club - at extreme south end of Budd Inlet, adjacent to City of Olympia's Percival Landing in Olympia. About 160 feet of dock closest to clubhouse is designated guest moorage. First 2 days free. Limit of 5 days in one-year period. Power at \$3 per day and water on docks. Tie up to guest dock and fill out registration form at kiosk. Located next to downtown Olympia with groceries, restaurants, marine services and shopping. State Capital within walking distance. On bus routes for great sightseeing adventures. Orcas Island Yacht Club - in West Sound, Orcas Island. First 2 days free. 200 feet of unattended dock without power or water. Yellow zone on east side of dock reserved for OIYC members. Lock code to showers and restrooms are available from Dave or Sam at Bar in CFSA. Covered picnic shelter with large bbq and sink/clean up area. Walking, hiking. Pleasant Harbor Yacht Club - located on the Hood Canal 2.7 miles south of Brinnon (47°39.70N and 122°54.80W). First 48 hours free on a 'first come' basis, then at posted moorage rates. Guest moorage on south side of "J" dock (end tie, outside), but may be assigned to vacant PHYC berths if reciprocal moorage is occupied by paying guests. Facilities include 30 and 50-amp power, water, washrooms, showers, laundry, pump-out, garbage and re-cycle (cardboard), swimming pool, hot tub, marina store, deli and fuel. Point Roberts Yacht Club - at Point Roberts Marina. 2 slips, first 48 hours free after which moorage will be charged at \$1 per day. 30-amp power at \$5 per day and water at slips. One stay in 30-day period. Showers, fuel, laundry, pump-out facilities. Full service boat yard, chandlery and restaurant/pub available at marina. Prior to arriving contact Marina on VHF 66A or telephone 360-945-2255 and identify which club you are representing and that you wish reciprocal with Point Roberts Yacht Club. Port Angeles Yacht Club - in Port Angeles Boat Haven. Use guest docks as Yacht Club does not have club docks. Reimbursement for up to two nights moorage (limit \$25 per night) if copy of bill for Port Angeles Boat Haven and copy of your current membership card is submitted by mail (PAYC, PO Box 692, Port Angeles, WA 98362). Limit 2 boats per day (first come, first served), 3 nights per year per boat. Power - 15 and 20-amp - and water on docks. Register with Harbormaster or call Marina at 360-457-4505. Port Hadlock Yacht Club - in Port Hadlock. 2 mooring buoys at east end of mooring field north of The Old Alcohol Plant. First three days free. 2 slips at Port Hadlock Marina also available - first day free. For latter, register with the marina manager. Water and power at \$3 per day available at slips. All usual facilities of marina and small town available. No website available. GPS location to be clarified in June 2009.

Port Ludlow Yacht Club - at Resort of Ludlow Bay. 80 feet of dock space on inside of first float at east end of Resort at Ludlow Bay Marina. Space boats closely to maximize use of dock space. First come first served. First 2 days free per month. 30 and 50-amp power. Free WiFi. Showers, washrooms, laundry, pumpout, porta-potty dump and store available at marina. Shuttle to 27-hole golf course. On bus route for grocery shopping at Port Townsend, Port Hadlock. Check in at Marina office, 360-437-0513. Marina monitors VHF channel 16. Port Madison Yacht Club - North end of Bainbridge Island in Port Madison. Yacht club docks are immediately west of the Seattle YC out-station. To reach the guest dock pass around the west end of docks to the long dock (100 ft) on the inside of the finger piers. Caution – check depth. Best to go in near or at high tide as entry shallow. Clubhouse with kitchen and restrooms (no showers). Limited to 15-amp power - no overnight plug in. In residential area so there are no nearby shops or restaurants, but very friendly yacht club. <http://www.portmadisonyc.org/>

Port Orchard Yacht Club - Lies on the south side of the westerly Puget Sound waterway known as Sinclair Inlet across from Bremerton Naval shipyard (47°32.25N and 112°38.45N). The 388 ft of guest dock is on the outside of the POYC northern float and is indicated by yellow signs. Overflow might be accommodated in vacant member slips by assignment only. Registration is located on "M" dock. Facilities include 30-amp power at \$3 per day, water, garbage, pump-out, restrooms, showers, telephone and ice at \$1 per bag. Normal small town facilities are located nearby. First 3 days free, then \$5 per day with permission of POYC officers to a total of 14 days. Join in club activities or functions. Port Townsend Yacht Club - 2 berths in Port Townsend Yacht Haven. One is slip 281 on D dock (available year round), other slip from June through August assigned by moorage office. In no case shall a boat remain in Reciprocal moorage for 2 consecutive nights. Sign guest book located inside small dock stand at slip 281. First 24 hours free. One night only May - September. First 48 hours free per calendar quarter (two 48 hour visits must be interrupted by a minimum of 48 hours). Space boats closely to allow maximum moorage. Power (30 amps - \$3 per day) and water on visitors' float-book exchange, laundry, washrooms and showers in clubhouse. Pump-out available - best at high tide. Quartermaster Yacht Club - on the southwest side of inner Quartermaster Harbor (47°23.62N and 122°27.84W). Reciprocal moorage is on the east side of the float closest to shore and is approached from the south side of the facility. Use caution at low tide. First 48 hours free. Power (30-amp at \$4/day) and water on float. There is no garbage disposal. Washrooms in clubhouse. General store within walking distance. Shopping at northern end of Vashon Island, near ferry terminal, is accessible by bus Monday thru Saturday. Clubhouse: 206- 463-3309. Caretaker - Glenn McCormick on "SARA" at Bo6.

Tacoma Yacht Club - at Rushton, 2 miles east of Point Defiance. Reciprocal berths are on the first floats to the port inside the breakwater NW of the Vashon Island ferry slip. First 48 hours free. Tyee Yacht Club - northeast end of Lake Union just before the Freeway Bridge. First three days free with power and water on the floats. Gates to street locked at all times - please remember to get combination number when registering and relock the gates when you leave.
